# Fantasy

A fantasy is a make-believe story that could not happen in real life.

It might have funny things that happen at the beginning, middle, and ending.



When fluent readers read, it sounds like talking.

They are careful not to read the story too fast or too slow.

They read at a steady pace.

You can practice reading sections that slow you down to help you become more fluent.

## Summarize

Good readers can retell what they have just read in only a few sentences.

As you read, stop and think about what you have read so far.

## Alphabetize

Listing words in alphabetical order makes it easier to find specific words.

# Using *Go* and *Went*

*Go* tells about something that is happening  
now.

My friends go to the park.

*Went* tells about something that has already  
happened.

My friends went to the park last week.
