

# Monitor Comprehension: Adjust Reading Rate

Good readers pay attention to what they are reading about.

Sometimes readers read too quickly and don't understand what they are reading. If a good reader notices this happening, he goes back and rereads more slowly.

# Details

Details are small pieces of information that make writing interesting to read and help explain the story.

Details can tell how something looks, sounds, smells, tastes, feels, or acts.

Fluent readers read in phrases.

They make their reading sound as it does when someone talks.

They read words that go together and then pause.

They pause when a sentence is over and when they see a comma.
